



Monday 18th January 2021

Please read the **text for Monday below** with your child. Read through the questions and encourage your child to use words from the text in their answers (not what they know from this familiar story). Try to write your answers in full sentences.

Tuesday 19th January 2021

Remind your child of *The Three Little Pigs* story from last week.

Encourage your child to think carefully about each of the three pigs in turn and work together to discuss what we know about each of the pigs.

In the Home Learning Book, encourage your child to write sentences about each of the three pigs in turn under the subheadings: First Pig, Second Pig and Third Pig. Encourage your child to describe each of the three pigs and evaluate their choices, giving evidence from the text if they are able to,

e.g.

The Third Pig was a wise pig because he chose to build his house from bricks.

Encourage use of full sentences, remembering capital letters and full stops.

Wednesday 20th January 2021

Explain to your child that today they are going to pretend to be one of the three little pigs and explain exactly what happened to them in the story by writing sentences using time adverbials: *first, next, then, meanwhile, after that, afterwards, finally* etc. Work together and say some ideas first, pretending to be one of the pigs talking about their experience, see example below.

Your child will then choose to pretend to be either the first, second or third pig and in their Home Learning Book write an account of what happened to them using time adverbials, the past tense and full sentences...

e.g.

First I decided it would be a good idea to build my house out of...

Next....

Then, all of a sudden... etc

Once finished, encourage your child to read their sentences from a character's perspective aloud, checking that their writing makes sense.

Thursday 21st January 2021

Tell your child that the Wolf is becoming a real troublesome character in the stories we have been reading. Discuss with your child the ways in which he has upset characters in *Little Red Riding Hood* and *The Three Little Pigs*. Explain to your child that today they need to use their imagination to come up with a list of ideas of how to stay safe from a wolf. Encourage your children to really use their imagination here and as much as possible relate their ideas to things we know have happened in our traditional tales so far. Give your child time to talk through their ideas with you before starting.

e.g.

- *Stick to the forest paths.*

- *Don't go deep into the woods.*
- *If a wolf knocks at your door, don't let him in! etc*

Encourage your child to design their own poster entitled '*Expert Advice on How to stay Safe From a Wolf*' in their Home Learning Book. Once they have finished their bullet points they could also add mini illustrations alongside the advice.

Friday 22nd January 2021

Explain to your child that today they need to use their imagination and pretend to be the Wolf character. They can choose to be either the Wolf from *Little Red Riding Hood* or the Wolf from *The Three Little Pigs* or both. Work together to think and discuss all of the things the Wolf did wrong in the story/ stories and what he needs to be sorry for.

Encourage your child to pretend to be the Wolf and write a letter of apology to *Little Red Riding Hood*, *The Three Pigs* or both in their Home Learning Book today.

Remind your child to begin their letter with... 'Dear...' and end the letter with... 'From the Wolf' or something similar. Encourage your child to write in full sentences, use their imagination and also use information that we know from the stories studied so far, e.g.

Dear Little Red Riding Hood,

I'm sorry for tricking you by pretending to be your grandmother... etc.

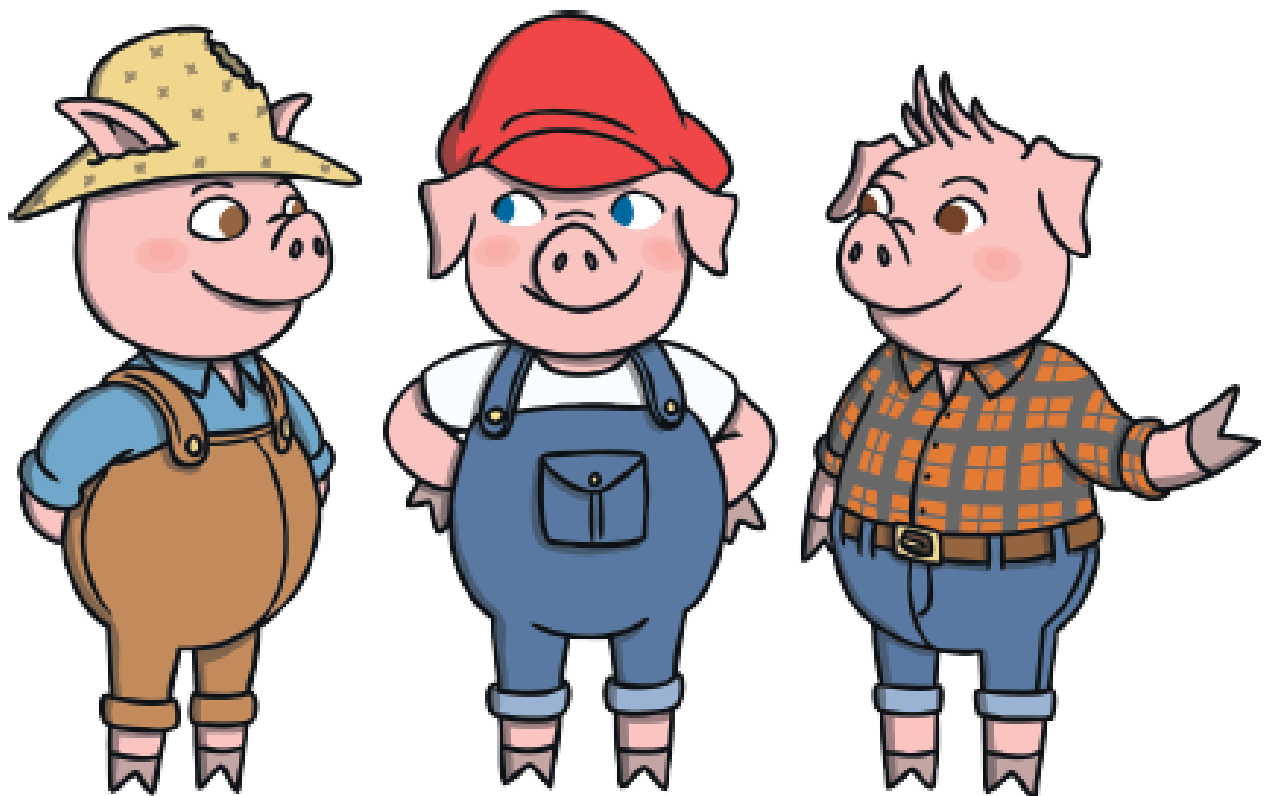
"Little pig, little pig, let me come in," the wolf snarled again.
