Spelling Rule: When paired up with 'n' at the beginning of a word, the 'k' is not pronounced. The 'k' and 'g' at the beginning of these words was sounded hundreds of years ago.

Use the **kn pdf** to discuss the silent letter.

Missing letters and words sheet below. Read the sheet together.

Dictate this sentence to your child:

**I know how to knock on the door.**

Discuss and model (this means write it out for them to see the correct spelling and punctuation)
